

**Kenosha County Disabled Golfer Policies and Procedures**  
*(to be posted in the clubhouse)*

- I. Kenosha County golf courses welcome golfers with disabilities. The courses are fully accessible to all golfers and include a continuous pathway throughout each course. All courses will make reasonable accommodations to ensure that golfers with disabilities are able to enjoy the course.
- II. All golfers that require accommodation for a disability must check-in at the clubhouse and inform the golf shop attendant that he/she requires accommodation. A copy of the Kenosha County policy regarding disabled golfers will be presented.

**Rules Applying to Disabled Golfers**

- III. At the time of check-in, any golfer stating a disability will be provided an orange attachable strap that must be placed on his/her cart post at all times. This strap will alert range staff that the cart is being used by a golfer that requires accommodation.
- IV. Any golfer stating a disability will be allowed to park up to 30 feet from the greens and tees. If there is a cart path that is located 30 feet or less from the tee or the edge of the green, then the golfer is required to park all four wheels on the cart path. *All non-disabled golfers must keep all four wheels of their golf carts on the golf cart path near all greens and tees.*
- V. If any golfer operates a golf cart within the 30-foot perimeter of a green or tee, the golfer will be given one warning by range staff.
- VI. If, after being given a warning by range staff, any golfer continues to operate a golf cart within the 30-foot perimeter of a green or tee, the golfer may be asked to leave the course without a refund.
- VII. Upon completion of a round of golf, a disabled golfer should return the orange attachable strap to the clubhouse.
- VIII. Any golfer may take a golf cart into the parking lot, but all golf carts must be returned after use.
- IX. When the course is too saturated with moisture from rains or flooding, and as determined by Kenosha County, all players will be required to keep all four wheels of the golf cart on the path regardless of disability.
